
# Celebrating 50 years of South Coast Rowing Championships

## ... Venue; PLYMOUTH held on Saturday 25th September, starting at 4.30 p.m. Programme 1/-

This was the 9th South Coast Championship Regatta, and the first time at Plymouth where the programme cost ONE Shilling.

The weather leading up to regatta day was overcast and wet! but thankfully the day was dry but very overcast. The Chairman of Plymouth ARC ( Tom McKnight) welcomed the Associations and Clubs to this the first South Coast Championships taking place here on the river Plym, they considered themselves fortunate in possessing such attractive amenities and have pleasure in welcoming so many highly skilled rowers to compete for the title of "Champions of the South Coast". The Senior Championship from the "Bideford Bowl" was a terrific race between the three leading crews, with only 1/2 length separating them for all the race, with Southampton easing into the lead in the final run in, to win by 2ft. Folkestone won an exciting Jun-Senior Championship being drawn on the farside, to come from behind to beat Plymouth by 1 1/2 lengths. In the Junior Championship BTC Southampton took the lead from the start to win easily.

1966 ..... Venue; BOURNEMOUTH held on Saturday 24th September, starting at 12.30pm. Programme 1/-

This was the fourth South Coast Championship Regatta hosted by the Hants & Dorset ARA, the first and only time held here at Bournemouth. On a bright but breezy day, we all arrived at this new venue for the South Coast Championships, to find a straight 1 V2 mile course from Branksome Chine to Pier Head. In the first Championship race, we saw the Jun-Senior from B.T.C. take the lead over Shoreham, and win by 1 V2 lengths. While the Junior`s from B.T.C. had to give second best to Brighton in an exciting race. The Senior race for the "Bideford Bowl" turned into a fantastic race, neck and neck throughout, finishing in a dead-heat, so both Folkestone and Shoreham had to race again, this time it was again neck and neck with nothing to split the two crews until the final run in when Shoreham managed to get ahead and win by 3ft (a first Bowl win for the Club) In the Open events Bexhill won the Senior very easily, while Christchurch lead in the Ladies for most of the race, then in the final race for the line Torquay proved the stronger to win by V2 length.

My memories by Eddie Tanswell, I remember it so well, like it was only yesterday, time does not fade great memories. After forming a new Junior Four with fellow Brighton C.C, Club members Ralph Crowley, Jimmy Dowds, Stuart Tait and myself at stroke with coxswain Kevin Fry. We started to win at CARA regatta's until Southsea regatta, when we lined up against BTC Southampton. We had a terrific race, neck and neck throughout the race, losing by 1/2 canvas, the time had come to increase our training if we were to overturn this defeat at the Championships. The build up to our first South Coast Championships was all that we had expected, arriving at Bournemouth with nerves jangling, we lined up for our race along with our other CARA crew from Deal and that BTC Southampton crew, it was going to be tough. From the gun it was so close, by halfway we had a canvas on them, but they were still coming on strongly, 200 metres to go, it was either of us, with lungs bursting, we gave it all we had and crossed the line 1/2 length ahead. All that extra training had paid off, we were now South

1967 . Venue; SOUTHSEA held on Saturday 23rd September, starting at 1,30 p.m. O'h dear Programme 1/-

This was the 11th South Coast Championship Regatta and was hosted by the Coast ARA here at Southsea. The 1 ½ mile course was from Cumberland to Lumps Fort with the alternative course at Langston Harbour. The day dawned very wet and windy and the decision was taken to move to the alternative course at Lanston Harbour. After the move, we saw the mist roll in from the sea as the first Championship race being the Junior got under way, as the crews rowed away from the start and disappeared into the mist and rain Southampton Coalporters lead the way with a fine 2 lengths win. Next up the Jun-Senior`s of Christchurch who dominated the race, winning by 5 lengths. The Senior Championship for the "Bideford Bowl" saw Coalporters, Shoreham and Southampton break away from the field, with not more than 2 lengths between them. In the last 1/2 mile Shoreham pulled clear to win by 1/2 length over Coalporters with Southampton 3rd a length back. Shoreham completed the double by also winning the Senior Open.




## Memories are made of this at Dartmouth ....

With the 50th South Coast Championships being celebrated here at Dartmouth in 2006, we look back in the past when we have seen many excellent races, none more so than in 2002 when the Championships moved from Torbay due to rough weather. Bexhill won an exciting Bowl race by ½ length over Lymington, this also stopped a Hants & Dorset clean sweep with Christchurch taking the J/Senior title, BTC Southampton winning both the Junior Championship in a thrilling race with Deal, and their Ladies taking the Ladies Senior Championship. Westover & Bournemouth won the Ladies Junior. In 1959 Dartmouth hosted their first Championship Regatta, with the host Club winning the Bideford Bowl by ½ length over Folkestone. Plymouth won the J/Senior title and Bexhill winning a close race by a canvas over Torquay to win the Junior Championship. 1969 saw Shoreham winning the Bowl, while Herne Bay won the J/Senior Championship then finished 3rd in the Bowl race. Bideford A.R.C. took the Junior Championship over Herne Bay. Southsea have happy memories of Dartmouth in 1984 winning Junior and Ladies Senior Championships also winning the Senior Open. Christchurch won the Senior Championship while Herne Bay took the J/Senior Championship. Exeter Senior Ladies found 1994 very successful with a 1 length win over Southampton. Shoreham won the Bowl and

Southampton Coalporters took the Ladies

Junior Championship easily.

Great memories .. 1984 was our best year after winning the South Coast Junior Championship the year before in 1983, we moved up to Jun/Senior and were unbeaten on the Coast, apart from at Southsea Regatta were Ryde had beaten us. Once again we lined up after a false start, in lane 5, with our two Hants & Dorset rivals on the inside. We started well .. rowing together strongly and had our noses in front, Ryde were still with us, then we made our move, which was decisive .. we left Ryde for dead and crossed the line in fine style .. Herne Bay rules the waves!

The first Championship race being the Junior, started the proceedings in great style with Bexhill and Deal neck and neck until the last few yards when Deal took the lead to win the first ever Championship for the Club in a river boat. Shoreham again proved dominant in the Senior Championship retaining the `Bideford Bowl` in fine style, while Southsea won their first ever Championship, taking the Junior-Senior title with a win over Christchurch.

Bexhill took an exciting Junior-Senior Championship over Christchurch, with Shoreham completing a Coast clean sweep by winning the Junior Championship with a very strong Junior crew, while Folkestone gave the Coast more success winning the Senior Open.

## Memories made at Southampton. (1960 - 63 - 71 - 83 - 91)

The Championships have been held here at Southampton 5 times, plus in 1975 when the Championship races only were held here, following the switch from Shanklin due to unrowable conditions on the Island.

It had been a hard season for us, Brighton's only Ladies crew of Maryanne Burt, Diane Netley, Beverley Featherstone, with stroke Olive Spurway and coxswain Matthew Drake, coached by Mac Lowrie. Racing had been between us and Shoreham with the up and coming crew from Worthing. In those days the Championship crews were picked on wins and then the crew showing the best current form. Shoreham had got the most wins, then Brighton and Worthing who had a few 2nd places between them. To some of the CARA officials, Worthing were the crew on form. So the decision was taken to hold a row off on the Shoreham canal, a week before the South Coast Championships. Worthing won the toss and chose the inside lane near the spectators. A lot of supporters had turned up to witness this row off race and Worthing seemed to be favourites, but our Brighton's crew spirits never wavered. It was a sunny day and the scene was set, we both had a cracking start, neck and neck down the course, the heat was on, this is what we had trained so hard for all season. We won this exciting row off and were now selected to represent our Association at Southampton. After the tension of the row off, the day of the Championships seemed a easier, as we sat on the starting line, on a cold and windy day, making the sea conditions awful and very choppy. We were stationed next to Shoreham on our bow side, they took an early lead from the start, but we kept sticking it in, to keep in touch, as our coxswain counted down the markers on the course. We all dug deep and started to row them down, for us there was no-one else in the race, it was just us two crews. We needed to be the best, as we started to get closer as the finish got nearer and nearer, We crossed the line 1/2 cvns in front, we'd done it! we were South Coast Champions, as they say first is first by whatever margin, no one can take our medals away. The rest of the day was a blur of jubilation for us, being the first ever CARA Ladies to win the Championship. We cheered as Herne Bay won the Bideford Bowl and the Junior Championship, what a day, also Worthing Ladies won the open race. By the way the `Seagulls` got to Wembley, but lost to Manchester United in a replay, What a year 1983 was!

Great Memories by Dave Marman; 1983 was our year as Coast ARA Junior Fours Champions the crew of Matthew Kerr, James Kerr, Russell Mount, myself at stroke with Ty Jemmett coxing. As Champions we were selected to represent our Association at the South Coast Championships being held at Weston Shore. We knew it was going to be tough, as our rowing rivals from the Hants & Dorset had beaten us at Southsea Regatta. The race was on we had started well, drawn No 5, in between the two Hants & Dorset crews, it was neck and neck,

Christchurch had a slight lead in the choppy conditions, but we hung in and started to move up, taking the lead .. rowing strongly we moved into a 3 length lead, then Coalporters started to close on us, closer and closer, where was the line, it was hurting now.

Our lead was now 1/2 length as the finish gun went .. we'd done it!. Rowing back to the boat area, with the spectators cheering, we showed off by rowing at a very slow rate, when suddenly it all went out the window and we were splashing about like ducks in acid. It felt good though to be Champions and later pictured here tossing in our young coxswain.

This was the 16th South Coast Championship Regatta and our fourth visit to Deal, being hosted by the C.A.R.A. after being well received at the civic

reception, the weather was cold and overcast but rowing conditions were good.

My memories of Deal in 1972 by Arthur Puttock (Hon Secretary CARA from 1947 till 1976) It being the Coast ARA to host the Championships, we saw 73 crews representing the three Associations. On the Friday evening prior to the regatta, the Mayor and Mayoress entertained the crews and officials at a civic reception held in the Town Hall. For the fifth year running the Coast ARA dominated all events both Championship and Open with 5 firsts, 3 seconds and 2 thirds, slightly better than 1971. Our Coast crews again proved their superiority on the water, our congratulations go to Folkestone on winning the "Bideford Bowl" for the first time, having been 'edged out' on so many previous occasions, this time winning by 3 lengths over Shoreham. In the J/Senior Championship Eastbourne had an equally impressive win by 3 lengths over Deal, a first ever Championship for the Club. While the Deal Juniors took the Dudley Ward Cup for Junior Championship with a 4 lengths win over Southampton. In the Open events Bexhill won the Senior by 1 length after a dead heat with Shoreham, Brighton took the Junior easily, while Torquay took the Ladies and Dartmouth won the Novice Open. Our thanks go to all those for organising the event and the Ladies who brought hot teas for those officials under and on top of the pier, (my word it was drafty down below).





This was the 17th South Coast Championship Regatta and the second time it had been held here by the WEARA. The weather was not good during the week up to regatta day, but conditions improved slightly to allow the racing to start. The first Championship race was the J/Senior, as the crews began to come to the line already very late, the Deal boat struck a floating log, so putting a hole in the boat, the crew were then sent ashore to find a replacement boat. After a very long delay the race got under way, with BTC, Folkestone and Deal, pulling away from the field. As the race unfolded so Deal edged in front to take the Championship. By now conditions had deteriorated and the evening was drawing in, all the open races were cancelled and the crews called ashore. The decision was taken to bring forward the Senior Championship and the crews took to the water, the race started in these darkening conditions, with Southsea (rowing under the Coast banner) and Christchurch setting the pace. Christchurch began to open up a lead and went away to win in fine style. By now the Junior Championship unfortunately were lining up on the start in the dark, and conditions were not safe (so much for water safety). From the start the Umpires could just make out the racing crews with BTC and Greenbank rowing clear, from Shoreham, Bexhill and Paighton all a length down, in these conditions we saw Greenbank crossing the line in first place, just in front of the following crews.

My memories of Appledore in 1974 by Arthur Puttock (Umpire) The Officials and Clubs were well received at the pre-regatta reception held in Appledore, but the regatta itself was a disaster. The weather during the run up to the regatta was bad and the committee had laid plans to move the event upstream to Bideford, but on the Saturday morning the weather seemed good enough to go ahead at Appledore, starting at 3.00 pm. Soon after the start, conditions grew worse and long delays became the order of the day, one can be wise after the event but many lessons have been learned which should influence decisions in the future. However, we have many friends in the West and Hants & Dorset, so we wish them no ill, we must all get together and sort out all the difficulties. I

felt sorry for all the crews that had to cope with these appalling conditions, but we shall return to the West again — that is for sure.

O'h dear, after handing back our hired car in Ryde, we travelled by ferry, then bus to Southampton. With Cyril (Umpiring) in the boat and me (Judging) ashore, all three Championship races went ahead. 



This was the 21st South Coast Championship Regatta and the fifth time at Deal. It was Deal Rowing Club`s "Golden Jubilee" year and to celebrate the Coast hosted the Championships here, but the strong north-easterly winds that had plagued the Club all season, forced the event to be switched to Folkestone. The Deal Junior Four set the standard for the day by rowing away from the nearest challengers Shanklin to win by 3 lengths. In the Senior Championship we saw Folkestone (who had just the week before rowed off with Deal for the honour to compete) go into a slight lead over the other crews, with not more than 1 length between them, as halfway approached Southsea started to edged forward and held on to win by 1 length in an exciting race.

As I paced up and down the promenade feeling like nothing on earth, with nerves so taut it made me feel sick, we were told we had drawn lane 4 and had drawn our own Bexhill boat, which I had built "the race was our's all the nerves had gone" From the start Coalporters took an early lead "We'll go through them, I velled" and by halfway we had taken the lead but Deal had started their push and were closing. Our coxswain David started to take us in and we crossed in front of Deal and went away to win. The elation, the tears, what the hell, we had done it, we were the champions.
